Call for Proposals: Awareness and Advocacy towards Palestinian Duty Bearers on Youth Human Rights

QUESTION	ANSWER
1. Does the co-applicant need to send the Concept Note as well?	The main applicant is only expected to send the concept note and include the co-applicant's name and role on the actions. There is no need for the co-applicant to submit a separate concept note nor a separate application.
2. Can the co-applicant be an INGO?	An INGO can also apply as a co-applicant if it fulfils the admissibility criteria. <u>Please refer to article 1.1.1. Admissibility of applicants. Pages: 7 & 8.</u>
3. Are activities eligible to be implemented outside Palestine?	Activities are expected to be implemented inside Palestinian territories, i.e., the West Bank including East Jerusalem and Gaza Strip. <u>Please refer to Geographical coverage. Page 9.</u>
4. The Call defines West Bank (including East Jerusalem) as one Zone and the Gaza Strip as the second Zone; is that right?	The first zone is the West Bank including East Jerusalem; the second zone is Gaza Strip. <u>Please refer to Geographical coverage page 9</u>
5. If the organisation is based in the West Bank, does the co-applicant need to be located in the Gaza Strip?	The concept note must be submitted by at least two actors based in two different geographic locations. <u>Please refer to page 8, co-applicant(s), first point:</u> <i>"The call for proposals must be submitted by at least two actors based in two different geographic locations (West Bank/ Gaza Strip): one lead applicant who applies together with one selected co-applicant."</i>
6. Can the organisation restrict its interventions to the West Bank and Gaza? And exclude East Jerusalem?	Activities are expected to be implemented inside Palestinian territories in the West Bank including East Jerusalem and Gaza Strip. <u>Please refer to Geographical coverage page 9</u>
7. Can one organisation established/operating in the West Bank and Gaza apply without a co-applicant?	The concept note must be submitted by at least two actors based in two different geographic locations. <u>Please refer to co-applicant criteria page 8</u>
8. Have the Concept Note to respond to all respected results?	It's expected that concept notes respond to all expected results. Please refer to the expected results of the call for proposals on top of page 6 of the guidelines.
9. Are organisations expected to work with all duty bearers in Palestine including the Palestinian Government and the de facto Government in Gaza?	Please refer to the fourth paragraph of page 5 of the guidelines: <i>"This Call for Proposals aims at supporting young Palestinians in reporting their complaints related to human rights violations perpetrated by the Palestinian duty bearers in both the West Bank and Gaza Strip. Special Focus will be given to the most vulnerable youth groups. This will entail that implementing partner</i>

	<i>organizations liaise with relevant Palestinian duty bearers (both the Palestinian Authority in the West Bank and the De Facto Authorities in the Gaza Strip)."</i>
10. Can activities cover only the Gaza strip?	Activities are expected to be implemented inside Palestinian territories including the West Bank, East Jerusalem, and Gaza Strip. <u>Please refer to Geographical coverage page 9</u>
11. Can the whole proposal be one large activity divided over the project timeline?	The action proposal should comprise a series of activities and not only one activity. Please refer to 1.1.3. Admissible actions: for what actions may an application be submitted? Page:9.
12. If the applicant and co-applicant are registered in both Gaza Strip and West Bank, can they apply?	Yes, they can apply. The concept note should clarify the operational areas of work of each applicant. The application should confirm that both organizations have proper coverage and presence in both main geographic areas.
13. Is there a limitation of maximum co-applicants?	The call for proposals does not limit the number of co-applicants. The main condition is that the call for proposals must be submitted by at least two actors based in two different geographic locations (West Bank/ Gaza Strip): one lead applicant who applies together with at least one co-applicant. Meanwhile, the main applicant should justify the reasons why a number of co-applicants are engaged in the implementation of the proposed action. <u>Please refer to co-applicant(s) criteria; page 8</u>
14. What info is needed for the first stage?	<u>Please refer to page 7 & 8 in the guidelines for the complete list of documents to be submitted</u>
15. If an organization (lead applicant) has an ongoing contract with ENABEL, are they eligible to sign another contract (for another project) during the same period?	There are no restrictions to apply for this call for proposals even if the organisation is already partnering with Enabel under another project.
16. What type of violations the call is targeting?	The call for proposals does not limit the type of youth human rights violations perpetrated by the Palestinian duty bearers in both the West Bank and Gaza Strip. Please refer to page 5 which provides that the call for proposals targets various youth human rights violations.
17. How many contracts ENABEL will sign under this call?	It's only one application (Main Applicant and its co-applicant(s)) which will win the project and receive the full amount of the Call.
18. What is the ground of exclusions for ENABEL?	<i>Please refer to Annex on Declaration on honour – exclusion criteria.</i>
