TENDER: “TZA22003-10120 - CONSULTANCY SERVICES TO BUILD THE CAPACITY OF WEZESHA BINTI PARTNERS ON SASA! TOGETHER APPROACH”

1. Submission Format and Eligibility

As per section 3.4.4 of the tender documents, soft copy submission alone is not compliant, hard copy must also be submitted.

International applicants may use reliable international courier services to ensure timely and compliant delivery, in line with the tender requirements.

The tender is not restricted to Tanzanian applicants. However, local presence and contextual knowledge may still be considered advantageous.

2. SASA! vs SASA! Together – Methodology Justification

SASA! Together is a revised version of the original SASA! methodology, with a primary focus on ending violence against women and girls (VAW/G). As stated in the tender document, Enabel’s interest lies in both gender-based violence (GBV) and sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR). SASA! Together aligns well with these priorities, particularly through its emphasis on power dynamics, gender inequality, and the structural factors affecting women’s ability to make decisions about their bodies and relationships.

While the original SASA! methodology includes a stronger focus on HIV prevention, the use of SASA! Together is appropriate and relevant in this context, as it better supports the project's objective of addressing VAW/G within a broader SRHR framework.

3. Clarification on SASA! Together Phase(s) and Intended Use - Clarification is needed whether the intent is to: (i) implement outcome three through full SASA! Together methodology, or (ii) adapt selected SASA! Together activities into the broader project framework.

As outlined in the tender, this consultancy will focus on SASA! Together as an approach, with strong emphasis on ethical implementation and support to implementing partners.

The initial training will cover the SASA! Together framework, with particular attention to the Set-up and Start phase. The exact support needs and expectations will be agreed upon during the assignment.

Further details regarding training content and structure will be shared and finetuned with the selected consultant during the inception period, as the consultant is expected to provide technical guidance on how best to approach this based on their experience.

Enabel intends to engage the consultant to support its staff and implementing partners ahead of each phase transition.

Therefore, this approach does not call for full roll-out of all four SASA! Together phases by the consultant, but rather tailored technical support aligned with the project's evolving needs and partner capacities.

- 4. Section 5.8 on the deliverable and timeframe: Openness to co-create the timetable and to work with the consultant to develop an alternative timeframe for the assignment. [...] the plan would need to change to accommodate the phased sequencing of the activities and to keep the plan to just Set-up and Start phase. While our intention is for the activities to be completed in a time frame of up to 32 days as recommended in the call, this would need to be stretched over a period of about 6-12 months. Would you be open to having the consultant rework the timetable to fit in this recommended timeframe for Set-up & Start?**

For this assignment, the consultant is expected to propose a timeline for set up and start phase only. The tender specifies 32 working days which can be worked up to 6 months depending on consultant's suggestion. - Remember that Enabel will seek services of the consultant again- at each phase to support the phase transition.
